1 Pursuant to Rule 65(b)(1) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Petitioners
2 hereby move the Court for emergency relief in the form of a temporary restraining
3 order directing Respondents to release Petitioners from their custody or to provide
4 Petitioners with individualized bond hearings before an immigration judge pursuant
5 to 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a) within seven days of issuance of an Order.

6 Petitioners seek this emergency relief because their continued detention
7 without an initial bond hearing is depriving Petitioners of statutory and
8 constitutional rights and is causing immediate and irreparable injury in the form of
9 the unlawful deprivation of their liberty.

10 Petitioners also seek a temporary restraining order enjoining the Respondents
11 from relocating Petitioners outside of the Central District of California pending
12 final resolution of this case.

13 Petitioners further move for the issuance of an order to show cause as to why
14 a preliminary injunction should not issue.

15 This application is supported by the Memorandum of Points and Authorities,
16 accompanying exhibits, as well as any additional submissions that may be
17 considered by the Court.
