**PETITIONER'S EX PARTE
APPLICATION FOR
TEMPORARY RESTRAINING
ORDER AND ORDER TO SHOW
CAUSE**

1 Pursuant to Rule 65(b)(1) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Petitioner
2 hereby moves the Court for emergency relief in the form of a temporary restraining
3 order (“TRO”).
4

5 Petitioner seeks an order enjoining Respondents from transferring him out of
6 this judicial district during the pendency of his Petition for a Writ of Habeas Corpus
7 or ordering them to return him if he has already been transferred. Petitioner also
8 moves this Court to order his immediate release on an Order of Supervision (OSUP),
9 which restores the status quo in place before Respondents unlawfully revoked his
10 OSUP and re-detained him, and to enjoin Respondents from re-detaining him absent
11 order of this Court or absent the provision of an informal interview where Petitioner
12 can contest the reason for the revocation of his OSUP and demonstrate that his
13 removal is not reasonably foreseeable. Finally, Petitioner also seeks an order barring
14 Respondents from removing him to a third country without notice and an opportunity
15 to be heard on any fear of persecution or torture he has in that third country.
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20 Petitioner seeks this emergency relief because his re-detention is depriving
21 Petitioner of constitutional rights and is causing immediate and irreparable injury in
22 the form of the unlawful deprivation of his liberty.
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24 Petitioner requests the Court schedule oral argument as soon as the Court’s
25 calendar allows and the parties are available, should it be necessary to resolve this
26 motion.
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1 Petitioner further moves for the issuance of an order to show cause as to why
2 a preliminary injunction should not issue.

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4 This application is supported by the Memorandum of Points and Authorities,
5 accompanying exhibits, as well as any additional submissions that may be considered
6 by the Court.
